Meet the San Francisco Arts Education Project.

Founded in 1965, the San Francisco Arts Education Project lives in that extraordinary space between children and their creative potential. In all, more than 200,000 of our city's children have participated directly in the arts through our organization – over 7,000 kids last year alone. Nothing thrills us more than seeing a child participate in the arts, thriving, building self-confidence, honing communication skills and becoming the kind of broad-minded, open-hearted adults who will brighten the planet.

We love summer. And it shows.

For more than 45 years, we have supported the collaboration between children and professional artists who bring passion and expertise to their art. And more than 15 years ago, we tried our hand at creating the kind of summer camp we'd like to have attended.

The result was, well, magic. We recruited some extraordinary artists, many of whom work with us in public school classrooms, in our after-school programs and in our SFArtsED Players youth musical theater troupe.



Making the summer sing.

Our most popular summer program is Broadway Bound. Kids 9 to 14 can spend their days learning to be a “triple threat” – a singer, dancer and actor in the great Broadway tradition.

The summer in vivid color.

Kids 9 to 14 can choose to draw, paint or sculpt in the visual arts program of Session Two. From cartooning and illustration to sculpture and clay, artistic adventures abound on paper, on canvas, in clay and, especially, in imaginations.

When you do it all, you're a Renaissance person.

During Session Two, campers 9 to 14 have a choice: spend half the day in performing arts and half the day in visual arts. Our Renaissance Artist Program gives campers more options and more opportunities to shine.

Kids having fun, learning and creating – it's called exploration.

Lucky kids ages 6 to 9 get to do it all. Our Exploration program for younger campers includes an exhilarating, daylong blend of everything from rhythms and theater to drawing and sculpting, from instrument making to contemporary dance. And so much more.

exploration > ages 6-9



S1: June 6-June 17 • S2: June 20-July 1 • S3: July 5-July 15

Full-day Exploration sessions are taught by enthusiastic professional artists who understand how best to help children spark their own creativity by investigating a broad array of arts disciplines. And keeping their interest high. Subjects include rhythms, dance, visual arts, instrument making, circus arts and musical theater. Each session offers a new variation on the performing and visual arts, keeping the mix varied and exciting. Every day, children enjoy structured and unstructured activities both indoors and outdoors. At a showcase on the last day of each session, these young artists present their proud new skills and creations for family and friends.

broadway bound > ages 9-14



S1: June 6-June 17 • S2: June 20-July 1

Full-day performing artists participate in our Broadway Bound program, which challenges young people with strong interest in theater. Classes will train the “triple threat” performer in singing, dancing and acting. Session One will focus on Broadway classics such as *West Side Story* and *The Sound of Music*, while Session Two brings focus to contemporary classics like *Billy Elliot* and *Wicked*.

Each Broadway Bound session culminates with showcase performances on the last day. Workshops and classes are conducted by a faculty of mid-career theater Artists. Families and friends are always amazed at the number of songs, theatrical scenes and dances performed at the end of these exciting two-week sessions.

the visual artist > ages 9-14

S2: June 20-July 1

Students will be engaged in a variety of media under the direction of impassioned artists who have long teaching track records. Working alone or collectively, kids will discover a variety of materials and artistic approaches to classic and emerging art forms ranging from cartooning and illustration to painting and fashion to sculpture and clay. There will be a curated exhibition for each area of study in a designated gallery space on site. Family and friends are invited on the last the session to view the work and speak to the young artists and their mentors.



the renaissance artist > ages 9-14

S2: June 20-July 1

Curious learners can spend Session Two creating a comic book and belting the big notes from *Spring Awakening*. For the Renaissance Artist, mornings are spent in visual arts classes with afternoons spent singing, dancing and acting in *Broadway Bound*. On the last day of the session, these artists will exhibit their visual artwork and perform in the *Broadway Bound* showcase.



guys and dolls performance > ages 9-14

S3: July 5-July 22

Last summer's staged concert production of *Carousel* was so successful we just had to do it again. We're thrilled to offer an opportunity for young performing artists to build on their skills as singers, dancers and actors. In *Broadway Bound* Session 3, days are spent in rehearsals with director Danny Duncan, musical director Henry Shin and choreographers Natalie Greene and Erin Hewitt for Frank Loesser's Broadway classic, *Guys and Dolls*.

Performers will be joined by SFArtsED Players alumni for two public performances with the UC Berkeley Summer Symphony. Shows are July 22 at UC Berkeley's Hertz Hall and July 25 at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music.



Summer camp in the heart of Noe Valley.

For the first time, SFArtsED Summer will be at James Lick Middle School, a fantastic facility located in one of San Francisco's most beautiful neighborhoods.
